300 YARD EGG SHOOT EVENT

Saturday, June 19, 2010

The 300 yard egg shoot event on 19 June 2010 will be conducted in 3 relays with a max of 5 shooters in each relay. The first relay will begin promptly at 3:00 p.m. The competition is open to all Summer Bash Ticket holders age 21 years and older.

You will shoot one round for score. There will be no opportunity for practice on the day of the event.

Permitted rifles will be any bench rest or hunting rifle of any caliber. There can be unlimited modifications in regards to actions, triggers, and optics. The rifle cannot weigh more than 11 pounds. Competitors must furnish their own ammunition.

The match format will proceed along these parameters:

The target eggs will suspended by strings inside a black box enclosure at 300 yards. The range house will have a red tape line parallel and 3 feet behind the shooting stations.

- (1). The first five shooter relay is called to proceed to the inside range house bench.
- (2). Each shooter may be accompanied by one coach/spotter. Spectators/gallery/distractors will be banned from the inside range house.
- (3). Each 5 shooter relay will be given a 5 minute preparation period to set up their shooting stations.
- (4). When the preparation period is ended all 5 stations will have been prepared, an open bolt indicator will be in each rifle and all competitors, coaches/spotters will stand behind the red line.
- (5). The first shooter will advance to the red line with his coach/spotter. He will be given 4 minutes to fire 4 shots at 4 egg targets. A stop watch will begin when he steps across the red line and will stop at the report of his 4th shot or when the 4 minute time limits expires. He will be scored by the number of eggs broken and by his elapsed time.
- (6). When the first shooter has finished the mandatory firing of all four of his rounds, he will insert an open bolt indicator into his rifle, step behind the red line, and become a spectator.
- (7). The next competitor will then shoot his turn-----all four rounds-----one person at a time. Once the competition begins, no competitor can approach his shooting station until he is called by the range officer to shoot.
- (8). After all 5 relay members have finished the course of fire, the range will be cleared and competitors can then remove their rifles and other equipment.

(9). Each of the remaining relays will be conducted in the above format.

(10). The match will have 1 winner. The winning score will determined by the number of eggs broken. In case of a tie, there will be no shoot off----- The shooter with the shortest elapsed time will be declared the winner. Winner takes all-----purse, trophy, bragging rights!!!

Spectators are advised to bring their own hearing protection.

All shooters must sign a liability waiver and are encouraged to pre-register. Good Luck!!
